Our culture is in constant denial of this fact and provides very little preparation for this profound transition.

FACING DEATH – EMBRACING LIFE is a two-day seminar that explores deeply held attitudes towards death and dying, including personal and cultural beliefs and the effect these have on our lives and society.

Therapists and teachers from many traditions acknowledge that underlying all fears is the fear of death and that a willingness to confront this fundamental belief can free us from unnecessary suffering.

Any major change in life has components of loss and grief and it is important that we understand more about the grieving process and honour it as an essential part of healing. By embracing change with grace and ease we can move more positively and freely towards the next stage of our lives.

This seminar explores the inescapable side of death and examines the nature of loss and grief, not only in relation to physical death, but also of life's little deaths. In a supportive environment, through shared stories, the experience of meditation and guided visualisations, participants explore acceptance of and preparation for a conscious death.

Judy, our senior educator, has conducted many of these seminars for people working with the dying and those living with life-threatening illnesses. Her inspiring, humorous, straightforward and sensitive approach makes this seminar accessible to anyone who is ready to deal with the inevitability of his or her own death and is looking to live life more fully now.
